of Conservation Voters. A lawyer by trade, Cardin has been active in Maryland politics for more than four decades. He served ten terms representing the Baltimore-based 3rd District (from 1987-2006), spending 17 years on the powerful Ways and Means Committee. Prior to that, Cardin served in the Maryland House of Delegates from 1967-1986.

Senator Cardin has supported broadcasters and extolled the virtues of localism in the recent past. In June 2014, he was one of five Senators who sent a letter to FCC Chairman Tom Wheeler voicing concern over the FCC's new rules regarding Joint Sales Agreements ("JSAs") and urging that the Commission adopt a waiver policy that does not penalize JSAs that were structured and executed prior to issuance of the Commission's new rules. In that letter, Sen. Cardin and his colleagues worried that the new JSA rules would undermine the ability of local broadcasters to serve their communities.

Senator Cardin has been opposite broadcasters on the radio performance fee issue, having cosponsored legislation to impose a performance fee in 2009-2010. Senator Cardin is also hoping to address concerns of constituents in Garrett Country who do not receive Maryland television stations because they reside in the Pittsburgh television market.

Senator Mikulski has represented Maryland in the Senate since 1986. She served in Congress for ten years prior to being elected to the Senate. She began

her political career on the Baltimore City Council in 1971. Mikulski has lived in Baltimore for most of her life. She was a social worker in Baltimore before entering politics, attending Mount Saint Agnes College and the University of Maryland, School of Social Work.

Mikulski has chaired the powerful Senate Appropriations Committee since 2012 and is the first Senator from Maryland, and the first woman, to hold that position. She is an advocate for higher education, senior citizens, women's health, and scientific research.

Congressman Harris has served the First District since 2011 and is characterized as being a solid conservative. He touts creating jobs and fixing the economy, reducing the deficit, improving healthcare, protecting Chesapeake Bay and the environment and veterans' rights as his key issues. Harris is an anesthesiologist who still practices at Memorial Hospital in Easton. Congressman Dutch Ruppersberger has represented Maryland's 2nd congressional district since 2002. From Baltimore, he attended Baltimore City College and the University of Maryland, College Park, before earning his law degree from the University of Baltimore. As a young attorney, he served as an assistant state attorney in Baltimore County. He and his wife, Kay, live in Baltimore. They have two children and three grandchildren.

Ruppersberger began his political career in 1985, being elected to the Baltimore County Council for two terms. He then went on to be elected Baltimore County Executive, a position he held from 1994 until 2002. Following redistricting, which made the second congressional district solidly Democrat, he successfully ran for Congress in 2002.

Congresswoman Donna Edwards has represented Maryland's 4th congressional district since 2008. The district includes portions of Prince George and Anne Arundel counties. A resident of Fort Washington, Edwards received her B.A. in English and Spanish from Wake Forest University, and earned her law degree from the University of New Hampshire School of Law. Edwards has been an active public interest advocate, fighting issues such as domestic violence and championing campaign finance reform.

She decided to enter politics when her son went to college. After running unsuccessfully in the primary against Al Wynn, the incumbent, in 2006, Edwards defeated Wynn in 2008 with over 60 percent of the vote. Following Wynn's resignation in June 2008, Edwards won the special election to serve out the last six months of his unexpired term. Congresswoman Edwards does not have a significant history of positions on broadcasting issues.



Delaware elected Senator Coons in a 2010 special election to fill the seat of Joe Biden, who resigned to become Vice President. Coons grew up in Hockessin, and he, along with his wife, Anne, and three children, currently live in Wilmington. He has a B.A. in Chemistry and Political Science from Amherst College, in addition to a law degree from Yale, and a Master's in Ethics from Yale Divinity School.

Senator Coons's political career began in 2000, when he was elected to the New Castle County Council, where he served as president for four years, and county executive for six years. Before becoming New Castle County Executive, Coons was an attorney at W.L. Gore & Associates, a large company that creates electronics, fabrics, industrial and medical products. The Senator has also spent time in South Africa, serving as a relief worker in Kenya and volunteering with the South African Council of Churches.

As a member of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Coons is in a position to engage on important issues relating to broadcasting, particularly those issues that are related to copyright law (i.e. performance fee and music royalty legislation and issues relating to delivery of video services).
